Take photos of you on the walk and upload to ClassDojo. <i>A Roman soldier had to march twenty Roman miles (18.4miles) in five hours carrying a full pack of weapons, shield, food etc – But we're not suggesting you need to do this!</i></p>

Draw the crossword grid and write the clues.</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Keep a food diary for the week. Do you have a varied balanced diet? How does it compare to a Roman's diet?</p>
				<p>Art and Design</p> <p>Romans used mosaics to show how wealthy they were. They would often show what Roman life was like. Draw/ make a Roman Mosaic. Remember to use a geometric border.</p>	<p>Imagination</p> <p>Roman Myths often involved fighting a mythical creature. Design your own mythical beast and write a fact file about it.</p>
				<p>Design and Technology</p> <p>The Romans made many weapons to help them conquer new lands. Design and make a catapult that can fire small objects. (Take photos of you making and testing it)</p> <p>SMSC</p> <p>Our Christian value this term is Love and Care. Discuss the Big Questions with family or friends; do you all have the same idea?
