At Kennington CE Academy, we are proud of our school uniform and we would appreciate it if the whole school wore the appropriate clothing, as it is part of the image of the school. All uniform and property should be named and we do not accept responsibility for loss or damage of personal items.

Our School Uniform:

- Plain White polo shirt or shirt
 - Black/Grey Trousers or Shorts or Black/Grey jogger bottoms or jersey shorts (with no logo)
 - Black/Grey pinafore dress or skirt (knee level or below)
 - Navy Blue cardigan or jumper with/without Kennington Academy logo navy blue.
 - Blue and White check summer dress

Our PE Kit ○ House Coloured T-shirt (logo or no logo) ○ Black/Grey jogger bottoms (no logo) ○ Black/blue PE Shorts ○ Blue/Black Hoodie (Non Logo)

Footwear ○ Black School shoes or Black Trainer Shoes (with no logo) ○ Black trainers for PE days only (non logo) ○ No Heels ○ Sandals are not allowed due to safety reasons ○ Plain Black non-heeled boots for Term 2 and 3.

Hair ○ Long hair must be tied back ○ No large bows or large hair accessories

- No extreme hair fashions are acceptable, including dyed or streaked hair
- No Mohicans or lines cut into the hair

Jewellery ○ Watches are allowed as long as they are not smart watches ○ No necklaces or bracelets – unless part of a religion ○ Earrings – must be small plain studs and not worn on PE Days.

- No make-up
- No coloured Nail varnishes or acrylic nails.

Following recommendation from the Department of Education and The Association for Physical Education (AfPE), children cannot wear jewellery during PE therefore if they have jewellery that they cannot remove themselves they will not be able to participate in the lesson due to health and safety. Teachers are not allowed to remove jewellery for them and covering up them with tape is also classed a health and safety issue to children.

Children are to come in PE kit on PE Days and Forest School Clothing for Forest School days . Please ensure that your child is in the correct uniform for the correct day
